**September 14, 2005**

**I.** The meeting was called to order at 6:33 p.m.

**II.** Roll Call

There was a quorum in attendance. Thirteen members were present.

**III.** Approval of Minutes

**IV.** Public Comment

There were no public comments.

CAC member George Croll reported that he has been using the new Breeze Bus for his commute from Santa Maria to Vandenberg Air Force Base and is pleased that this service is available and hoped ridership will increase. Terry Dressler added that the bike rack on the bus was paid for with APCD Innovative Technology funds.

CAC member Connie Hannah asked that a report on emission reduction credits (ERC's) in relation to Rule 331 be given at a future meeting.

**V.** Organization of Agenda and Statement of Interests.

There were no changes to the order of the agenda. Statements of Interests were not needed since none of the agenda items required a vote.

**VI.** APCO Report

There was no APCO report.

**VII.** New Business

A. Receive a report on air quality related legislation pending before the California Legislature.

Terry Dressler reported on three bills that were rejected during the last legislative session but may be reconsidered in the next session. They are:

CAC Minutes

- SB 44(Kehoe) General plans: air quality element – Requires cities and counties to add an air quality element to general plans.
- SB 109 (Ortiz) Air pollution: minor violations; stationary sources; prosecution of violations – District attorneys can assess criminal penalties after civil penalties have been charged.
- SB 870 (Escutia) Air quality: violations; non-vehicular sources; business penalties – Increase minimum/maximum penalties for violations and use for funding certain public health agencies.

B. Review of the APCD Mission.

C. Receive the APCD Annual Report.

Items “B” and “C” were combined and Terry Dressler presented the report. He stated the mission of the APCD is to protect the people and the environment of Santa Barbara County from the effects of air pollution. Mr. Dressler outlined the regulatory framework and the County’s attainment status. He summarized the highlights of 2004 and 2005 to date. He reported the upcoming issues as follows:

- Diesel ATCM implementation for stationary and portable engines
- Air toxics “hot spots”
- Federal 8-hour ozone maintenance plan (2007 Maintenance Plan)
- Agricultural sources in relation to SB 700
- Programming Moyer/DMV grant funds
- Marine shipping
- Rules – Clean Air Plan control measures (Rule 333)
- Public Outreach – “Don’t top off your tank” campaign and “Take a vacation from your car”
- Natural gas quality – “hot gas”

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 p.m.
