Hi Ad,

I am happy to hear that you are still in business with NoMoVo. The permit we issued to CCWS authorizes fermentation of red and white wines in all of the previously installed 400 series tanks, the installation of a new barrel room with a capacity of 2,500 barrels, and an increase to the daily mass emission limitations. This project triggered BACT requirements, and CCWS proposed the use of your system and the EcoPAS system as BACT. CCWS also proposed to implement control on all fermentation tanks, even though BACT was only required for the series 400 tanks.
