Clean Air Fund Background

- Established March 2019 with Board Resolution 19-03
- October 2020: Landscape Equipment Electrification Fund (LEEF Year 2) \$100,000
- May 2021: CALeVIP EV Charging Infrastructure \$300,000
- June 2021: Clean Air Room Pilot Program (Guadalupe/Casmalia) \$100,000

TRY ELECTRIC!

INCENTIVES FOR ELECTRIC LANDSCAPING EQUIPMENT

Commercial landscaping businesses, public agencies, nonprofit organizations, and schools can receive up to \$7,000 to buy electric equipment such as leaf blowers, mowers, trimmers, and chainsaws

Switching to electric landscaping equipment reduces air pollution impacts in neighborhoods and for equipment operators.













City of Lompoc 2024 Environmental Justice Element: "Community of Focus"




Sensitive Receptor Locations in/near the Community of Focus / CCA



Clean Air Centers Program: Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center: \$40,000 estimated grant

- 1,000 people use the Center weekly
- Preventative maintenance on 10 HVAC units and 320 MERV-13 air filter replacements over five-years





Clean Air Centers Program: United Boys and Girls Club of Santa Barbara County – Lompoc Unit Project: \$50,000 estimated grant

- Approximately 600 Club members
- Purchase and install two new heat pump systems
- Preventative maintenance and 90 MERV-13 filter replacements over five-years









Clean Air Centers Program: Lompoc Family YMCA \$20,000 estimated grant

- 1,000 teens and 300 adult memberships
- Preventative maintenance on three heat pumps and two HVAC systems and 300 MERV-13 air filter replacements over five years







Clean Air Classrooms Program: Lompoc Unified School District: \$200,000 estimated grant

- ~500 students attend both Clarence Ruth and Leonora Fillmore elementary schools
- Replace 60-year-old composite wood furniture in Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade classrooms with Ultra Low Emitting Formaldehyde furniture
- Immediate benefit to teachers and 367 students

















Community Outreach and Engagement: \$15,000 estimated cost

- District staff to work with external organizations and proposed project partners
- Partnerships will focus on sharing ways for the public to check and understand air quality data and prepare for wildfire smoke, with as much outreach conducted in English and Spanish as is feasible
- Outreach events will be shared with your Board through the Public Outreach Update Board letter

Dick DeWees Community and Senior Center	Replacement of 320 MERV-13 HVAC air filters over five years	\$40,000
United Boys & Girls Club of SBC – Lompoc Unit	Two (2) new heat pump systems and replacement of 90 MERV-13 air filters over five years	\$50,000
Lompoc Family YMCA	Replacement of 300 MERV-13 air filters over five years	\$20,000
Lompoc Unified School District: Clarence Ruth and Leonora Fillmore Elementary Schools	Ultra-low emitting formaldehyde furniture replacement for Kindergarten / 1 st grade / 2 nd grade classrooms at two schools	\$200,000
Community Outreach and Engagement	Community partnerships related to understanding air quality data and preparing for wildfire smoke	\$15,000
	Total Cost	\$325,000

Recommendations

- Receive and file a presentation on the Clean Air Fund Program for Lompoc
- Approve and authorize the District's Air Pollution Control Officer to implement an expenditure of Clean Air Funds, not to exceed \$325,000, by entering into agreements with the following entities:
 - City of Lompoc;
 - United Boys & Girls Club Santa Barbara County Lompoc Unit;
 - Lompoc Family YMCA; and
 - Lompoc Unified School District
- All agreements will be subject to review and approval by District Counsel,
 Risk Management, and Auditor-Controller
- Provide community outreach and engagement into the City of Lompoc
