



2026 CLEAN AIR GRANTS EMERGENCY GENERATOR PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION

Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (District) [grant funds](https://www.ourair.org/grants/) (<https://www.ourair.org/grants/>) benefit public health by cost-effectively replacing old, high polluting equipment with newer, cleaner equipment earlier than required by regulation or through normal attrition.

The grant funds come from the California Air Resources Board's (CARB) Carl Moyer Program, Community Air Protection Program, Funding Agricultural Replacement Measures for Emission Reductions (FARMER) Program, Climate Heat Impact Response Program (CHIRP), DMV surcharge revenue, and the District's Clean Air Fund.

Our 2026 Clean Air Grants program follows the most recent California Air Resources Board's [Carl Moyer Program Guidelines](#) and [Community Air Protection Incentive Program Guidelines](#). All funded projects must meet and comply with the requirements found within these guidelines.

FUND AVAILABILITY

- Applications will be accepted during the following time period:
 - **Open - Monday, July 27, 2026**
 - **Close - Friday, September 4, 2026**
- Applications submitted before July 27, 2026 or after September 4, 2026, will not be accepted;
- Successful projects will be eligible to receive a grant up to \$250,000;
 - *Actual grant amounts vary based on several factors, including but not limited to: usage, cost-effectiveness, emission reductions, eligible project costs, and fund availability.*
- Emission reductions from the project must be surplus to any rule or regulation;
- Projects will be competitively ranked, and priority will be given to zero-emission technology projects and projects located within [disadvantaged communities](#).
- The District has final discretion on how grants funds are prioritized and distributed.

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Public, private, and nonprofit entities are eligible to apply and may submit a maximum of one (1) application per program category;
- Project Applications are limited to:
 - One (1) new emergency generator replacement; OR
 - Multiple diesel particulate filters (DPFs) for eligible existing generators;
- Only applications deemed complete by the District will be eligible for grant funds;
- Incomplete applications will be returned to the applicant;
- Submittal of a complete application does not guarantee approval of grant funds;
- The District issues grant funds on a reimbursement basis. Reimbursement of funds does not occur until the applicant has paid for or financed the entire cost of the project;
- Applicants will provide documentation, such as Articles of Incorporation, that demonstrate that the person with Grant signing authority (Section B of the application) has the ability to bind the company/organization into a grant agreement with the District;
- Once all completed project applications are reviewed, the District will rank each project using a variety of criteria including, but not limited to, location, equipment technology, and emission reductions;



- The District performs pre-inspections of all projects that are selected for funding to confirm accuracy of the application information and verify operational status of the existing equipment;
- Once grant funds are depleted, any applicants with pending completed applications will be notified that grant funding is no longer available;

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for funds, Emergency Generator Projects must meet criteria located in the most recent [Community Air Protection Guidelines](#) and [Carl Moyer Guidelines](#).

Criteria includes, but is not limited to, the following:

EXISTING EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS:

1. Must be a stationary diesel-fueled engine that is:
 - a. Greater than or equal to 50 horsepower; and
 - b. Permitted with the District for emergency use; and
 - c. Tier 0 (uncontrolled), Tier 1, or Tier 2 with a PM emissions rating of equal to or greater than 0.40 grams per brake horsepower hour (g/bhp-hr).
2. Existing equipment must have a functional hour meter;
3. Existing equipment must be operational and in-service at the time of application. The applicant must demonstrate operability to the District at the pre-inspection;
4. Over the most recent 24 months, the existing equipment must have operated 100% of the time within Santa Barbara County and the applicant shall submit records that corroborate that usage. Exceptions will be determined by the District on a case-by-case basis;
5. Existing equipment must be destroyed at a place approved by the District prior to disbursement of grant funds.

REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS:

1. The replacement generator shall be a Tier 4 Final diesel generator or zero-emission technology;
2. The installation of new diesel particulate filters (DPFs) is also an eligible project type, in lieu of replacing existing generators. New DPFs must be a CARB-certified Level 3+ DPF or higher that is compatible with the existing engine;



3. A replacement generator should be no greater than 125% above the existing generators engine brake horsepower rating unless the larger engine would result in greater emission reductions. For replacement projects greater than Tier 4 Final, both the baseline and replacement generator must use the same load factor;
4. Any project selected for funding must meet all air district permitting requirements, including the attainment of a new or modified air district permit, if applicable;
5. Replacement equipment purchased prior to execution of a grant agreement will be ineligible for funds;
6. An approved project may also be eligible for partial funding of associated infrastructure such as power storage (power wall etc.);
7. Replacement equipment must operate 100% of the time within Santa Barbara County;
8. Replacement generator must have a five-year or 3,000-hour warranty, at a minimum. In the absence of a device to measure hours of use, the engine shall be warranted for a period of five years. The warranty must cover parts and labor, and the grantee must submit proof of purchase to the District;
9. Emission reductions generated must not be used as marketable emission reduction credits, or to offset any emission reduction obligation of any person or entity;
10. Funded projects must not be used for credit under any federal or state emission averaging banking and trading program.

3. Proof of Existing Stationary Engine Usage (covering, at minimum, the previous 24 months).	
➤ Hour meter reading log (collected at least once per year from a functional meter)	
4. Proof of Compliance	
➤ Sign and date the CARB Regulatory Compliance Statement (page 8) and submit with application. Please note the District will perform a compliance check on the existing generator's permit. Equipment not in compliance with all applicable rules and regulations are not eligible for funding.	
5. Existing Stationary Engine Documents	
➤ CARB engine certification (CARB Executive Order) if existing engine is Tier 1 or Tier 2	
➤ APCD Permit to Operate	
6. Replacement Stationary Engine Documents	
➤ Current itemized dealer price quote	
➤ Manufacturer's specifications (including make, model, HP, standard and optional features) for generator, diesel particulate filter (if applicable), and power storage (if applicable)

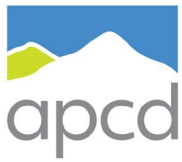

J. Application Statement of Terms and Conditions

1. Projects approved for funding are required to use our [Standard Grant Agreement template](#);
2. I have legal authority to apply for grant funds for the entity described in this application;
3. The proposed project is not required to be implemented by any local, state, and/or federal rule, regulation, or other legally binding requirement;
4. No replacement equipment has been purchased and no work on this project has begun or will begin until the Grant Agreement is fully executed by the District Board of Directors or by the Air Pollution Control Officer;
5. I understand the grant will reimburse a portion of the total costs and I must retain copies of receipts and cancelled checks to prove that I paid for the total project cost before receiving reimbursement;
6. I understand there are conditions placed on receiving a grant and agree to refund the grant (or a pro-rated portion) if it is found that I do not meet those conditions at any time;



7. I understand I must complete the equipment purchase specified in the application no later than the period of performance stated in the Grant Agreement. This deadline may be extended for cause if requested by the applicant and approved in writing by the District;
8. I understand it is my responsibility to ensure that all technologies are either verified or certified by CARB to reduce NOx, and/or PM pollutants;
9. I have attached hour meter reading documentation that validates the historic operation of the baseline equipment for at least the most previous 24 months;
10. I understand any existing equipment/engine that has been replaced must be permanently destroyed and rendered inoperable. This work shall be documented by the District;
11. I understand that the existing engine may not be removed from the equipment until the manufacturer's permanently marked serial number is documented by District inspection or a District tamper-proof tag is affixed to the engine that ensures the engine's identity can be verified after removal;
12. I understand that both the existing equipment/engine operates and the new equipment/engine/motor will operate 100% of the time within Santa Barbara County;
13. I understand that I must submit usage reports annually to the District for the life of the project;
14. I understand I will be prohibited from applying for any form of emission reduction credits for this funded vehicle/equipment/engines including: Emission Reduction Credit, Mobile Source Emission Reduction Credit, and/or Certificate of Advanced Placement, for all time, from the District, CARB, and/or any other district. Applicants are eligible to claim credits generated under the Low Carbon Fuel Standard (LCFS) Program;
15. I certify that I have disclosed if the proposed project has been funded or being considered for any funds by another air district or any other public or private agency;
16. I understand that disclosure is required of the value of any current financial incentive that directly reduces the project price, including tax credits or deductions, grants, or other public financial assistance;
17. I understand that a tamper-proof non-resettable digital hour meter/odometer must be installed and functional on the equipment/engine;
18. I understand that the District has the right to conduct audit inspections to ensure the project equipment is fully operational and at the activity level committed to in the grant agreement;
19. I certify that the requested funds do not include administrative costs. Administrative costs are defined as costs related to application preparation and submittal, project administration, monitoring, oversight, data gathering, and report preparation. I will provide all funds necessary to cover administrative costs and any required matching funds required for this project;
20. I understand that an IRS Form 1099 may be issued to me for the incentive funds received. I understand that it is my responsibility to determine the tax liability associated with participating in the Clean Air Grants Program;
21. I have signed and submitted to the District a CARB Regulatory Compliance Statement to certify compliance with all federal, state, and local air quality rules and regulations at the time of application submittal;
22. Agreement to Conduct the Transaction Electronically. Counterparts may be executed and delivered via facsimile, electronic mail (including pdf, digital signature, or any electronic signature complying with the U.S. federal ESIGN Act of 2000, California's Uniform Electronic Transactions Act (Cal. Civ. Code 1633.1, et seq.) or other applicable law) or other transmission method, and any counterparts so delivered shall be deemed to have been duly and validity delivered and be valid and effective for all purposes.
