Outlook for Overview


Smoke: Today: Moderate conditions should exist in all locations in the morning, but should clear out in the afternoon. Winds from the NW to N may push smoke over Goleta and Santa Barbara this afternoon and tonight though most of the smoke is expected to stay aloft. Hazy conditions can be expected along the coast, with occasional periods of moderate air quality due to the weak marine layer. Nightly smoke is expected to drain into the Santa Ynez valley impacting Santa Ynez and Lompoc clearing in the afternoon. Tomorrow: Similar impacts are expected.

Fire: The Whittier Fire is 18,015 acres and is 36% contained. Fire behavior yesterday was active on the west and east flanks. The fire continues to creep down slope on the eastern, western and southern edges of the fire. Firefighters expect flanking runs and some short intense burning as the fire backs into drainage bottoms and aligns with slopes. Warmer temperatures, lower humidity and winds will increase fire activity as the day progresses.
